Pay increased at consortium

Administrative employees of the Thumb Area Consortium received a minimum 10 percent pay increase when their new salaries were approved last Thursday by the consortium Administrative Board.

The increase for the 22 persons (plus two part-time positions) take effect Oct. 1, the start of the new fiscal vear.

The consortium administers the federal Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) program in the upper Thumb and all salaries are paid with money from Washington.

The proposed new salary schedule was prepared by a committee of board members, working with consortium Executive Director Frank Lenard.

The only objection raised at the board meeting was that of Margaret Wenta. county commissioner from Tuscola county, who thought Lenard's proposed salary of \$32,000, up from \$28,890 he is receiving this year, was too high

No one would second her motion to set it at \$30,000. That was followed by approval of the entire salary schedule.

The pay scale, Lenard explained, was based on an increase in the starting wages of 5 percent over what it was last year. After the six-month probationary
