AROUND THE FARM Plan now



for 1981

High yields don't just happen. They are planned! Is your 1981 checklist made out yet? It should be . . .calendarized and all. The list should include all those

production inputs you can control to increase yields. Be sure the following points are on your check list and are scheduled for maximum contribution to yield:

1) Variety: University and commercial seed variety trials provide results that help you choose the right variety for your area. Select varieties that fit your management program. Find out what plant populations or row spacing they demand to maximize yields. Improper variety or population selection could cost you many bushels per acre in yield potential.

2) Be prepared to plant on time: Early planting may be the biggest key to top yields in 1981. Applying P and K this fall may avoid a twoweek delay in planting during a wet spring. Every day's delay can cost you yield. Order all your mater-

ials early: seed, chemicals, and fertilizer. Don't waste valuable planting time next spring waiting for mater-

3) Watch your soil fertility: Use soil tests to help determine fertilizer and lime needs. Test often. Lime to the recommended pH for the crops you plan to grow. Fertilize for maximum economic yields. Build soil test levels, especially P and K. Remember, high yields remove large amounts of nutrients, so keep up with maintenance rates. High fertility can pay big bonus dividends when stresses hit your crop.

4) Know your chemicals: What weed and insect pests gave you the most trouble in 1980? Make plans to control

them next year.

5) Look back to plan ahead: Recall those problems you had with this year's crop, plant stands, weedy areas, insect problems, nutrient deficiency, or poor drainage. Correct them for 1981.

6) Keep good records: Document what you plan to do. Evaluate how well you stuck by your plans. Compare records and results. This will help you identify and eliminate yield limiting factors. No yield is tops. There are always higher yields to seek. Plan for them

Cass City flu clinic Oct. 14

The Tuscola County Health Department is sponsoring free flu vaccination clinics this fall.

Hours at each clinic will

be 11 a.m.-4 p.m. Flu vaccine this year will consist of inactivated trivalent preparations to protect against Influenza A-Brazil, A-Bangkok, and B-Singapore.

The U.S. Center for Disease Control recommends that persons over age 65, plus persons who risk serious consequences from the flu, should receive the vaccine.

High risk conditions for persons under 65 would be heart disease, chronic disorders which affect pulmonary functions, such as asthma, cystic fibrosis or orthopedic. disorders which impair ventilation, kidney disease, diabetes or other diseases which increase susceptibility to infection, or severe anemia.

Persons who are pregnant and have a "high risk" condition should consult their physician about the need for


