Expectant parent classes set

A new series of expectant parent classes will start Wednesday, Oct. 29, at 7 p.m.

There will be a series of seven classes, once a week, in the basement meeting room A.

The following topics will be discussed: --Male and female anatomy - fetal growth and development. --Body changes in the expectant mother. --Nutrition and breast feeding.

--Labor and delivery - breathing and relaxation exercises. --Tour through the maternity department. --New infant and mother. --Infant care - family planning and contraception.

Couples are recommended. If a husband is not available, mothers-to-be are encouraged to bring a relative or friend who can give support and encouragement at home and during labor.

The classes will utilize lectures, demonstrations, informal discussion and a variety of visual aides and film strips.

There will be a fee, made payable to Hills and Dales General Hospital, which should be brought to the first class.

A doctor's permission must be given for anyone to take the classes. The forms will be available in doctors' offices or may be obtained from the hospital and must be brought to the first class. The asymmetrical cuts have unequal lengths on one side.

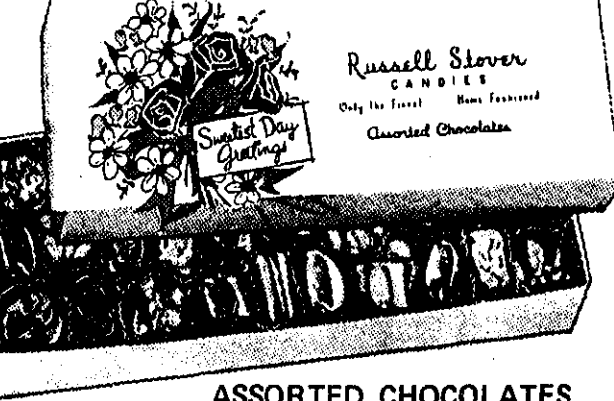
