I haven't decided
whom to vote for

With less than three weeks to go until the election, Aleta Wills has yet to make up her mind whom to vote for for president.

"I've never been this undecided," she said, adding that about everyone she talks to is also undecided.

"Everybody says Carter does such a terrible job," Mrs. Wills explained, but with all the problems this country faces, "I don't know if it's all his fault." But then thinking of all the people out of work, she adds, "This unemployment thing bothers me."

As for Ronald Reagan, she is of the understanding that federal judges must retire at age 70. If so, "what are we doing electing a president that old?"

What also bothers her about the Republican candidate is "the fact he may still be thinking he's on the stage."

Mrs. Wills thought independent candidate John Anderson "came out with some strong points" in his television debate with Reagan, but feels that voting for him "would be like wasting your vote." She also said she doesn't know that much about Anderson.

She feels it might have been beneficial if President Carter had participated in the debate. "It might have brought out some things people are in the dark about."

As for the three constitutional tax proposals on the Michigan ballot, Mrs. Wills is opposed to the Tisch amendment, but "hasn't made up her mind on the other two. Concerning the Tisch tax cut proposal, she commented, "You can't go on with the things people want today and cut taxes. Where are they going to get the money?"

Mrs. Wills retired in June after 23½ years of selling furniture for Reimann-Snyder Co. in Bad Axe.

She and her husband, Elgin, have two daughters, JoAnn (Mrs. Gerald) Vincent of Uby and Helen (Mrs. Raymond) Waggoner of Vassar, and six grandchildren.

Flu vaccine, immunization offered

Flu vaccine will again be offered free by the Sanilac County Health Department to individuals considered to be in the high-risk group.

This includes persons 60 years of age and older and chronically ill persons age 15 years and over. A chronic illness is any condition which lowers the body's resistance to infection, such as diabetes, heart, lung, or chronic kidney disease.

Sites where it will be given include: Oct. 21 and Oct. 28 at the Health Department clinics in Sandusky and Oct. 21 at 1 p.m. in the Mindes City Hall.

Additional locations will be announced soon. Call the health department at 648-2166 if you have questions.

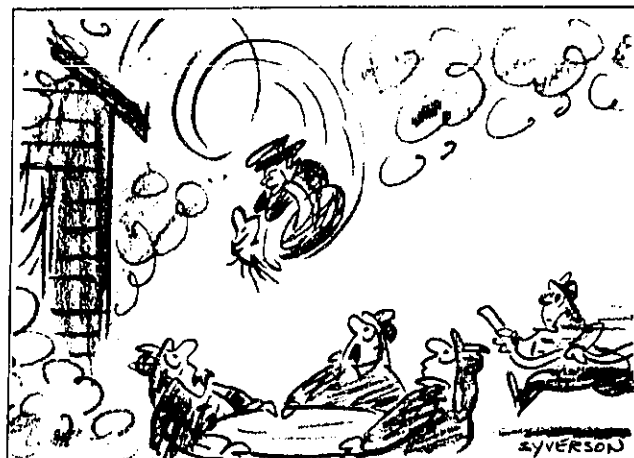
Persons who do not fall in any of the above categories are urged to contact their family physician for the flu vaccine.

The regular immunization clinics, as mentioned, will be Oct. 21 and 28, at the department's office at 115 N. Elm Street. Hours both days will be 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1:30-4 p.m.

Other than for flu shot patients, parents whose last name begins with A-M should attend the first day if possible; N-Z on the second day.

Protection against measles, rubella, mumps, whooping cough, diphtheria, tetanus, and polio, plus tuberculosis tests, will be offered.

Children three months and older can attend. A parent or guardian must accompany their children. They should bring a record of previous immunizations.
