Class slated in farm hydraulics

When it comes to farm equipment repair, most farmers prefer to handle the job themselves but hydraulic parts on many modern farm implements are causing big problems, says Donald E. Holzhei, an associate professor of technology at Delta College.
Holzhei's answer is an "agricultural hydraulics seminar." The identical two six-hour sessions will be offered Wednesday, Dec. 3, and Saturday, Dec. 6, starting at 9 a.m.
The sessions are designed for any farmer or farm implement dealer and will be held in Room L-113 of Delta's Technical Division.
"Almost all modern farm equipment has hydraulics on it," says Holzhei, "and farmers could use some basic knowledge on how these critical hydraulic-driven functions work. It is possible for the average farmer to repair these units saving hundreds of dollars."
