Changes due for telephone directory

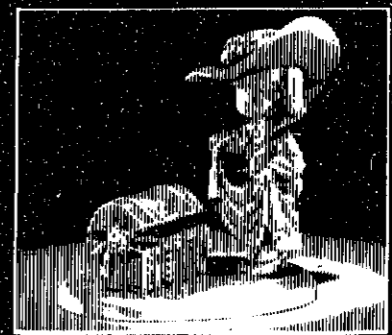
General Telephone is now compiling information for its new telephone directory.

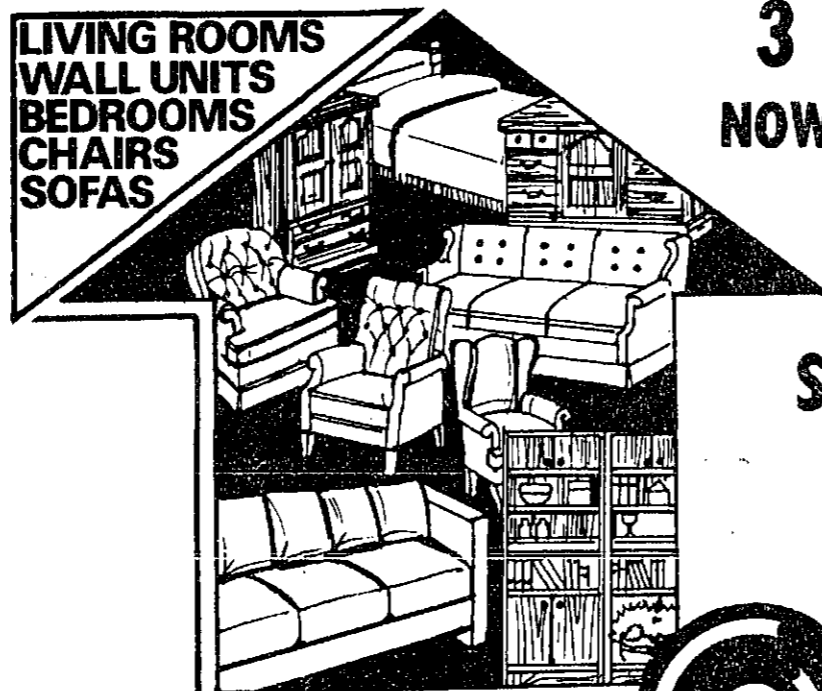

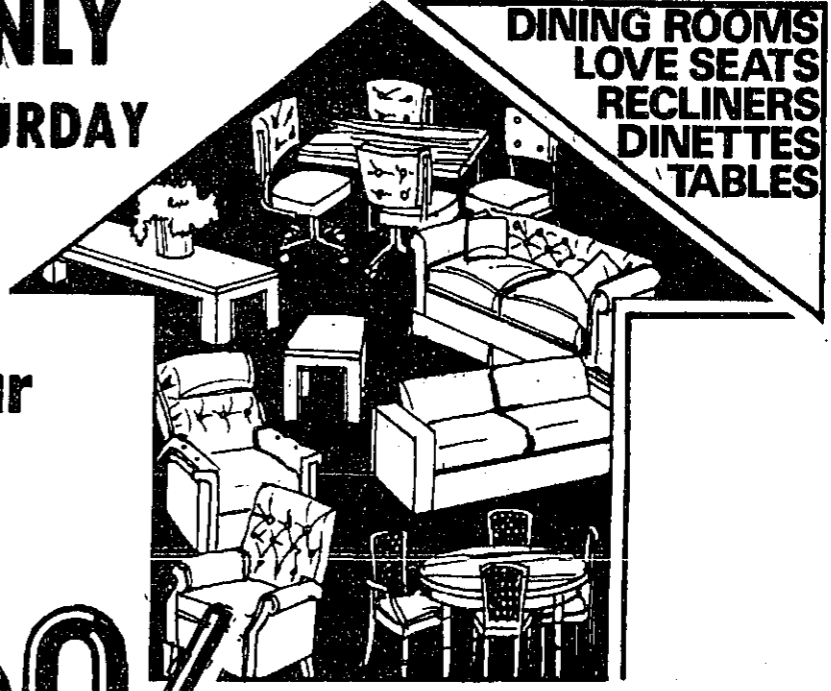
