Milk output increases in October

Milk output from Michigan's dairies totaled 426 million pounds in October, outweighing last year's production by 17 million pounds, according to the Michigan Agricultural Reporting Service.

The state's 400,000 cows kept rate per cow 4 percent above the October, 1979 rate, averaging 1,065 pounds per cow.

Dairymen received \$13.60 per hundredweight for their milk this October, \$1.10 above last fall's price. Slaughter cow prices are up 2 percent from a year ago, but the cost to replace a dairy cow is up to \$1,300, climbing 16 percent above the 1979 price.

The nation's milk production during October totaled 10.5 billion pounds, 3 percent more than October, 1979. Production per cow averaged 960 pounds, 24 pounds above last fall. Milk cow numbers averaged 10.9 million head, 1 percent more than a year ago.
