Pontiac Catholic had a regular season mark of 14-5, with some of the losses being to Class B and C schools. It year. tied for first place in its league.

The district win was not her team's best game of the season, coach Judy Campbell confessed afterwards, but it was more than enough to defeat the only team which had beaten the Bulldogs during the North Cent-

Owen-Gage has now won the district title in five of the last six years under Miss Campbell, the only time it didn't win having been last

For most of the first quarter at Carsonville-Port Sanilac, the district tournament site, the action was nip and tuck, but the Bulldogs pulled out to a 12-8 lead at the end.

The team got to within seven, 38-31, but the Bulldogs then added enough points for the final margin.


