Five persons were arraigned before Circuit Judge Patrick R. Joslyn Monday on various drug delivery charges, most having been arrested during the county-wide "drug bust" in early November. Larry J. Overfield, 30, of State Street, Caro, stood mute to charges of delivery of PCPY and delivery of marijuana. Pleas of innocent were entered and pretrial hearing scheduled Jan. 19. Bond was continued.

Eugene M. Bilicki, 22, of 2650 S. Plain Road, Caro, pleaded guilty to delivery of marijuana Sept. 4 in Novesta township and to supplemental information classifying him as a habitual offender. The latter charge, of having been convicted of earlier felonies, will result in his receiving a longer sentence. His pleas were accepted. A sentencing date is to be set. The guilty plea of William B. Ciupke heads Walbro plant

Werner W. Ciupke is the general manager of Walbro de Mexico, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Walbro Corporation, according to Robert H. Walpole, senior vice-president, Walbro Carburetor Group. The plant, located in the Parque Industrial de Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, is a key unit in Walbro's worldwide carburetor manufacturing organization. Walpole pointed out Ciupke brings to the assignment a unique background in manufacturing management of Mexico-United States border industries, plus an in-depth familiarity with Mexican labor and business regulations and import-export procedures. Since 1968, he has been involved with companies producing high-volume consumer products in various labor-intensive border industries, most recently with Kelsar Corp., a Chula Vista, Calif., manufacturer of microfiche equipment and plastic medical specialties. His latest assignment was as technical director and general manager of a Mexican assembly plant, after having had total responsibility for its original layout and set-up.
