## Tyrrell on 2nd place meats team

Michigan State University's meats judging team claimed second place in national competition Dec. 5 at the U.S. Meat Animal Research Center at Clay Center, Neb.

The MSU team consists of Muriel Hoenke, a senior from Flint; Judy Tyrrell, a junior from Uby; Lisa Kuenzli, a junior from St. Johns, and Aubrey Schroeder, a senior from Tecumseh.

They placed behind Texas A&M in the contest, which included teams from 20 universities and colleges and 80 contestants. Out of a possible 4,000 points, Texas A&M claimed 3,569 points and MSU, 3,481.

Each team had to determine the quality and yield grade of beef, lamb and pork carcasses and explain the reasons orally and in writing. As a team, MSU placed second in beef grading, second in lamb judging, fourth in beef judging and seventh in pork judging.

In preparation for this event and the six others the team entered during the season, each member spent about 20 hours a week in practice and study.

Part of the team's expenses are underwritten by the MSU Department of Animal Sciences. Substantial funding is provided by the student-operated MSU Block and Bridle Club.

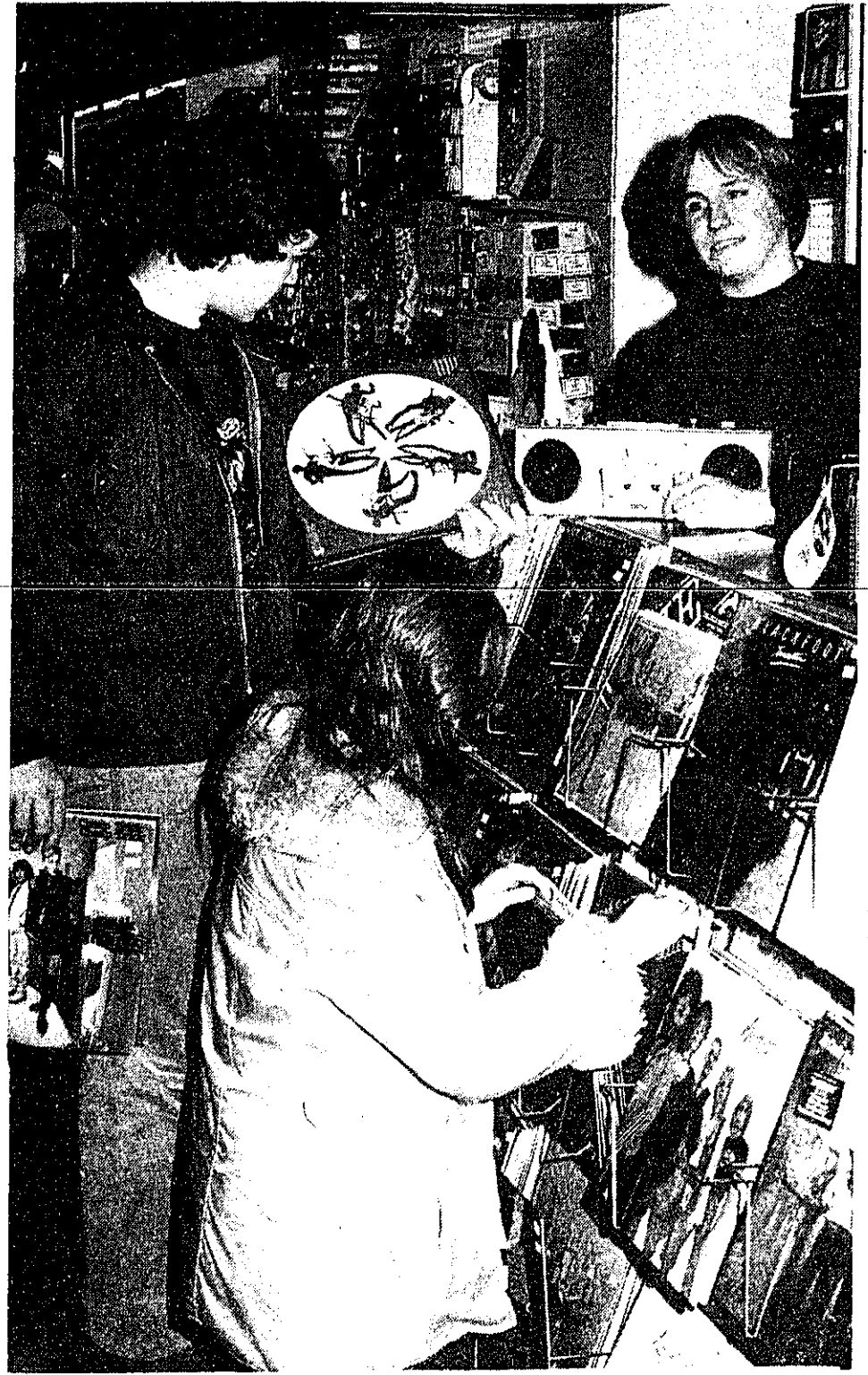
## High yield contest set in area
