Elenbaum renominated to commission

James Byrum, executive secretary of the Michigan Bean Commission, has announced nominees for three positions on the Commission.

District 6, made up of Huron county, has James Fuhrman of Port Hope, a dairy and cash crop farmer seeking the position, along with Gerald Elenbaum of Owendale, also a dairy and cash crop farmer.

Fuhrman is an active member of the National Farmers Organization and Port Hope Methodist church and is a sales representative for agricultural related products.

Elenbaum, currently serving as chairman of the commission, is completing his first term and is seeking re-appointment. He is also serving as chairman of the Production Research Advisory Board, and is active on many other boards, including those of the Pigeon Co-operative, Sebawaing Sugar Beet Growers and is past chairman of the National Farm Bureau Sugar Committee.

The other nominees are from District 2, which consists of six central Michigan counties, and representing shippers.

In each of the three situations, Gov. William G. Milliken will select one of the two nominees to serve on the commission for a three-year term, subject to confirmation by the Senate.

He was born April 5, 1898, in Elkland township, the son of Walter and Myrtle (Karr) Mark.

Mark married Mita Hall in June, 1927, in Redford. Following their marriage, they made their home in Redford, moving in 1941 to Hubbard Lake, where they operated a resort.

In 1954 they retired to Florida, where Mrs. Mark died March 9, 1961.

Mark married Mrs. Mae Jones in April, 1963, in Florida. She died in May of this year. Mark then moved to Saginaw.

He was a member of the State Street United Methodist church of Saginaw. He was a veteran of World War I, serving in the Army Air Service.

Mark is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Larry (Lois) Arthur of Saginaw; two grandchildren, Scott and Karen; one brother, Alton Mark of Cass City; one sister, Mrs. Esther Hunter of Cass City, and one nephew, Robert Hunter, also of Cass City.

Funeral services were conducted Monday afternoon from Little's Funeral Home, Cass City, with Rev. Donald Porteous of the State Street United Methodist church of Saginaw officiating.

Burial will be in Elkland cemetery.
