

Sparks in India on month tour

Deborah Sparks is one of six Adrian College students who will be spending Christmas in a remote Indian village 180 miles north of Calcutta.

She is the daughter of Rev. Myra Sparks of the Gagetown and Owendale United Methodist churches and Rev. Wayne Sparks of the Caseville United Methodist church. The family lives in Caseville. Deborah is a junior majoring in sociology and biology.

The six students, accompanied by a college professor and a secretary-photographer, plus three other persons, will be touring India on a 30-day "journey of understanding."

The entourage will travel by plane, train, car, and on Christmas Eve, by horse cart. The itinerary includes stays in New Delhi, Srinagar in Kashmir, Bombay, Madras, Calcutta, the Santal Parganas region of the province of Bihar, Varanasi (Benares) and Lucknow.

In charge of the group will be Adrian sociology and anthropology professor Dr. George Somers, who lived in India for 10 years between 1962 and 1978. Seven of those years were spent in the Santal Parganas, where the group will spend from Dec. 24-29 as guests in village homes.

Area subdivision

Developers face drainage suit

The Tuscola County Building Codes Division has filed suit against the owners of the Chippewa Trails subdivision, south of Cass City, to force them to fix a spillway to prevent sediment from flowing into the Cass River.

The suit, filed last Wednesday by the prosecutor's office in behalf of Building Codes Administrator Paul Lefler, asks the judge to issue an order requiring the defendants to show cause why a preliminary injunction should not be issued requiring the defendants to immediately take measures to control and correct the drainage-way and spillway which are causing erosion and sediment to flow into the river.

The pond on the property is formed by damming a drain that flows into the river. The drainage-way flows from the pond to the river.

The state Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act requires measures be taken to prevent erosion and sediment from flowing into bodies of water.

According to the suit, Lefler issued a temporary permit Nov. 8, 1979, to Chippewa Trails, for erection of temporary measures for maintenance of the drainage-way from the pond to the river.

The permit expired Nov. 23 of that year and, claims the suit, the defendants never applied for a permit to erect permanent controls,

nor have controls been installed, despite specifications provided by the Department of Natural Resources and recommendations for permanent measures from the Soil Conservation Service.

The suit has been assigned to Circuit Judge Patrick R. Joslyn.

Guilty plea accepted

He is charged with trying to run over Deputy Arthur Adam with the tractor Oct. 13, 1979, in Watertown township, while the officer was attempting to make an arrest.
