### Pesticide recertification test nears

No changes have occurred in the restricted use, farmer crop weed control herbicides, reports Don R. Kebler, Tuscola county extension agricultural agent.

Paraquat CL is the only one requiring certification. All grain and soil insect fumigating materials are restricted, which includes Thimet 15 and 20G, Furadan 4 Flowable, and Dyfonate 4 EC. Parathion and its derivatives, Toxophene, Guthion, most all Aquacides, systemic insecticides and Avicides are restricted use pesticides.


Because private applicator certification is expiring soon for many farmers, the question arises as to renew or not the certification.

At this time, if none of the above pesticides have been needed in one's normal farming operation, a renewal is not necessary. However, precautions Kebler, no one knows when or what common use pesticide will be placed on the restricted use list.


Restricted use certification is something like insurance. One carries it, hopes they never have to use it, and are real happy to have it if the need arises.

The certification renewal test consists of 25 questions. No additional exam is needed to be re-certified for the farm operator's grain fumigation certificate.

Re-certification costs \$10 and is for three years. The test is not that difficult, just good common sense, Kebler said.

## New books at the library

**THE RING**, by Danielle Steel (fiction). A diamond signet ring is the symbol of the passion and the tragedy of the Von Gotthard family. The ring first belonged to Cassandra, a well-born German woman whose Jewish lover is seized by the Gestapo on the eve of World War II. Next, the ring is held by Cassandra's daughter, Ariana, who after fleeing to America, tries to hide her family's connections with Nazi Germany - especially from her Jewish-American husband. Finally, Ariana's son gives the ring to the lovely Tamara, a girl whose secret lineage again immerses Ariana in her tumultuous past.

**THE WHITE ROBIN**, by Miss Read (fiction). Young Helen Cogg's first spotted the white robin, then the vicar saw the white bird and was positive that it was a white robin. Soon Fairacre was agog. Henry Mawne, the local ornithologist, wrote a long essay on albinism in British birds for the Cass City Chronicle, accompanied by photos of the beautiful visitor. Most were very proud and very protective of the robin, but the white robin came to a tragic end, much to the grief and fury of the villagers, who were well acquainted with the culprit. Miss Read's books strike a chord in the hearts of country-lovers everywhere, from Japan to England.

**THE BASEBALL READER**, edited by Charles Einstein (non-fiction). Between 1956 and 1968, Charles Einstein produced three baseball books, the Fireside series, that won national acclaim from his professional colleagues as well as a permanent place in the hearts and memories of literate baseball fans. The "Baseball Reader" is a fan's delight, the All-Star Game and the World Series rolled into one.
