much as 85 percent of body heat may be lost through the top of your head. 'Don't smoke outside ir

cold weather," Dr. Anbe said. "Of course, it's bad for your heart to smoke at any time, but in cold weather, i sort of puts a 'double wham my' on your heart by constricting the blood vessels even further.

"If your car should become stranded in the snow, think twice before trying to push it out. Again, you're talking about a tremendous workload for the heart. It is perhaps better to remain in the car and wait for help than to risk pulled muscles, a strained back and even a heart attack trying to get it out yourself.

"Don't go off by yourself on activities like hunting or skiing. The buddy system is a much safer idea; if something does happen, there's another person to help out. "Also," Dr. Anbe said,

'you should know the warning signs of a heart attack and be prepared to act immediately if they should occur. The warning signs of heart attack are:
