The treasury department will send two expert officials to Honolulu in a few days with the cash to pay the bonded indebtedness of Hawaii, amounting to \$3,200,000. This payment was authorized by the act of annexation, but the money was not appropriated by Congress until the last session. Holders of Hawaiian bonds in the islands will be given tnirty days notice and the English bondholders who have about \$800,000 will be given three months notice of the grade remedy.
