Business was not very active among

prices being quoted in lines that are
becoming more plentiful as the warm
weather continues. New potatoes are
lower, but there is no change in old,
the market in that direction being
very quiet. Eggs are lifeless and
demand. Dairy butter is more
easy. Dealers note a large increase in
shipments and in a few days there
promises to be plenty. The cream-
ery grades are easy and in good sup-
ply. Vegetables are active and fruits
steady. The sugar market is firm.
