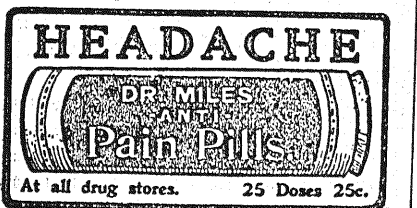

The demand for strawberries was good and the market held steady, although the supply was large. The demand for vegetables was brisk and prices well sustained. There was good demand also in the line of fruit. Eggs were in good supply and unchanged in price and the supply of all kinds of butter was ample and market easy. General trade was good at the tone of the market active and steady.
