A TRIP THROUGH CENTRAL DIXIE. Continued from first page. We went to the battle grounds of Chickamauga in Georgia, nine miles out, where a great battle was fought Sept. 19 and 20, 1863. Here a regiment of cavalry is constantly stationed. The government owns the field, over 6,000 acres, and has built 75 miles of crushed stone roads from Chattanooga on the battle grounds.
