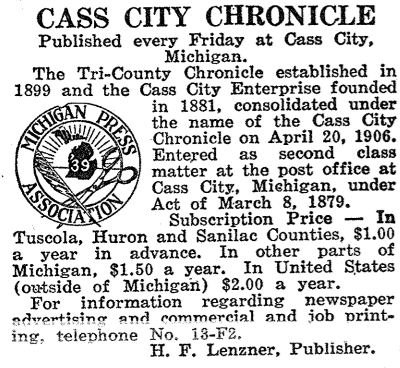

Lansing—Within a few days Michigan will harvest from thousands of acres of idle waste land a \$4,000,000 crop.
Visitors to the No. 1 summer vacation state may wonder at the apparent uneconomic worth of the vast forest areas in the northern counties of the Lower Peninsula and those in the Upper Peninsula.

Million Deer
Are deer decreasing in number?
During the past four years it has been possible, through the vast manpower in the Civilian Conservation Corps, to obtain fairly accurate counts of deer on measured areas.
These counts indicate an average of more than 15 deer per square mile in the Upper Peninsula and over 42 deer per square mile in the Lower Peninsula.
